BIBLE READING: JONAH 2:1-10

Having been tossed out of a ship to save the rest of the passenger and crew, Jonah was gobbled up by a whale.

He was trapped.

There he sat inside the whale – he didn't even know what he was sitting on – and started to have a think about things.

'All right,' he said to himself, and his voice sounded echoey and spooky, 'all right, I disobeyed, but God could have sent someone else. I'm nobody. The message could have been given to someone important, a priest or a prince or something, not to me, I'm nobody.' And the words 'I'm nobody' went on echoing and ringing round the great vaulted inside of the whale for far longer than the other words until Jonah's head was banging. And then suddenly all was deathly quiet. Jonah was now looking at himself very honestly and seeing himself very clearly – as of course you can when it's pitch dark – Jonah saw that he was really at a very low point, the lowest ever, lost, alone, very unhappy – and all really his own fault.

He now felt very humble and very wretched. He asked God to give him another chance. He promised to do as he was told. He remembered, and was grateful for, all the good things in his life given to him by God and spoke quietly and sadly into the vast listening silence for quite a while. When he'd finished he felt better. Of course!

Well, nothing happened for a time. And then, far off, Jonah began to see a golden glow. After the darkness it hurt his eyes a bit. It got no bigger. Jonah got up, stretched his cramped legs and walked forward. The glowing shining spot grew larger. Jonah walked faster and along the whale's tongue and out through the whale's open mouth and on to dry land! The glow was God's sunshine and the gold was the yellow sand.

Jonah stood and wept with relief and joy. As his clothes dried in the hot sun they began to smell a bit fishy, but he kept his mouth tight shut about it. He offered up a heartfelt prayer of thanks and waited for God to speak.

He waited quite a while. Not a word.

So Jonah thought that perhaps the subject ought to be broached by him.

'Er – God,' he said, 'I haven't forgotten the message. Not a word. You said I was to go to Nineveh and tell them that you know all about their wickedness and that in forty days after I get there the city will be destroyed and the people will perish. That's what you said. I was to go and tell them. And God' he said, 'I'll go right away'.

And he did. Straight from that empty beach to Nineveh. His steps were guided and his journey safe.
