All: We're here to rise in hope.


Leader: Jonah got a second chance. So did Nineveh

BIBLE READING: JONAH 3:1-10





Very impressive place, Nineveh. For those days a big city. A hundred and twenty thousand people lived there. And God was right. The people were wicked and cruel and they had forgotten him.

At first they all laughed at Jonah and were rather rude, but there was something about this cross little man and eventually Jonah was brought before the King.

The King told him to stop shouting and to tell his story quietly. Which Jonah did. The King listened insilence and realised that it was all true. He had ruled badly and the people had all gone to the bad. He had a long serious talk with his government and then issued a great proclamaton. He said, 'Everyone is to fast; you are to pray to God for forgiveness; you are to dress in sackcloth and you are to stop the violence and evil ways.' Then the King himself dressed in sackcloth and began *his* fast.

Jonah watched all this without saying too much. He'd told his story and delivered the message. If this huge city had got themselves into this highly dangerous position it was their look-out. Mind you, in his heart of hearts Jonah didn't really believe that God would do it, but he said nothing.

In the course of a few days he saw a whole city change its ways. The gambling and the debauchery and the cruelty and the evil and the selfishness disappeared. The people walked in fear of the Lord, silent, fasting, praying. One day the King, who was now very pale and thin and wasn't a bad chap really, said to Jonah, 'Who knows,' he said, 'who knows, Jonah? Perhaps God may yet forgive us all. Perhaps He will lose his fierce anger and change his mind so that we don't all perish. Who knows?'

Jonah had, as we've seen, his own ideas as to how likely the all-merciful God was to wipe out a hundred and twenty thousand people.

'Ah,' he said, 'who knows?'

Now the "me was nearly up. The people were hollow-cheeked and weary. Even the most hardened evildoers had mended their ways. There was no gossip, no rumours, no lies, no slander, no raised voices. Truth and honesty had come. People rediscovered simple values and they blamed only themselves and repented and prayed, from the heart, for forgiveness.

And of course God did forgive them.
